Provide constructive feedback that will assist this peer teacher in developing teaching skills. On the reverse side, place a check in the appropriate boxes and provide written comments. Peer feedback is most helpful when it is supportive and specific. A comment such as "You did a nice job" may make the peer teacher feel good, but comments such as "Your questions during the lesson really made me think" or "Your lesson flowed so smoothly that I followed every step" are more useful to the teacher. Negative comments also need to be specific to be both supportive and helpful. Comments such as "It wasn't clear to me how the introduction to the lesson fit with the next activity" or "I felt nervous when you paced back and forth during the lesson" would inform the peer teacher.
