Evaluation: Differentiated Lesson

Using what you have learned about differentiating instruction, take *three* lessons that you have taught in your practicum and re-create them as differentiated lessons. You must differentiate one lesson for each one of these: learner readiness, learner interest, and learning profile. Your packet should include an introduction that describes the makeup of your class and why you chose the lessons to differentiate that you did. Then, include for <u>each</u> differentiated lesson a complete and thorough lesson plan in which differentiation is evident, any supporting materials (worksheets, etc.), and a 1 page (maximum) description (single spaced) of <u>how</u> you chose to differentiate, <u>why</u> you chose these modifications, and how you capitalized on student strengths as well as accommodated challenges. Your differentiated lessons will be evaluated according to the following criteria:
