Evaluation: "Educator" Paper

The reason you were asked to reflect on your own personal growth and development is because I believe that your conceptions of yourself impact your work with others, including your students. In this paper, you are asked to build upon your reflections on your self and to reflect on how the knowledge you are gaining in this course will affect how you work as a teacher with diverse students. Make sure to address at least two of these populations: racial and ethnic minorities, English language learners, low income students, students with special academic needs, students who differ from yourself in terms of gender or sexual orientation. Think about the following: What types of teaching strategies will you use and why? How will your communication style be affected? What types of goals will you work toward in your classroom, building, or district? How will your curriculum be altered? This paper will support the work you do for your Standard 3 portfolio essay. The paper should be *approximately* 2000 words.
